ATLANTA ORGANIZATION CONTINUES TO SUPPORT SINGLE PARENT HOMES

Atlanta (July 10, 2008) – Onechildhood, a nonprofit organization that serves children who live in single-parent homes announced today it has changed its name but will keep the same mission of supporting children’s dreams. The organization was formally known as Presence with a Purpose and will continue to provide children with financial assistance, support, encouragement and guidance to help grow a positive environment.

“Onechildhood is my heart and my passion,” says Katherine Conn, executive director of Onechildhood. “I have a personal connection because I am a single mom and I want to continue to help children who are often overlooked because they do not have the same resources and opportunities of most children.”

Onechildhood has helped numerous children in Atlanta and has confirmed several upcoming events. A fundraiser is scheduled for mid August as well as a sled hockey clinic later in the year. The sled hockey clinic is a new initiative created by Onechildhood and USA Hockey has partnered with the organization to coordinate the first program in the State of Georgia. Sled hockey is designed to allow participants with physical disabilities to play the game of ice hockey.
